The following measures were developed by the North Tahoe Public Utility District, utilizing guidelines from Placer County, the State of California and the CDC and shall be implemented to protect employees, boaters, and the general public from the transmission of COVID-19 while recreating at the TVRA boat launch.

Signage

Signs shall be placed at the entrance to the Tahoe Vista Recreation Area Boat Launch, on restroom display boards, at TVRA boat launch ramp, dock, and other relevant buildings to inform all employees, boaters and the general public that they should:

- Avoid entering the facility if they feel sick, or have a cough or fever;
 - Maintain a minimum six-foot distance from anyone who is not a household member;
 - Sneeze and cough into a cloth or tissue or, if not available, into one's elbow;
 - Stay in their vehicles in the staging area and prior to launching;
 - Abide by all posted entry and inspection guidelines, payment process, launching rules and exiting process;
 - Not engage in any unnecessary physical contact; and,
 - Employees are required to wear a face covering.
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A. Measures to Protect Employee Health

- This is a boat launch facility which requires employees to staff it and cannot be staffed remotely.
 - All employees have been told not to come to work if sick.
 - Symptom checks are being conducted before employees enter the workplace.
 - Staff are being instructed to maintain physical distancing whenever possible.
 - Restrooms are being disinfected 3x daily.
 - Disinfectant and related supplies are available to all employees at the following location:
 - Restroom Building Chase
 - Hand sanitizer effective against COVID-19 is available to all employees at the following location(s):
 - At staff work area
 - Restroom Building Chase
 - Soap and water are available to all employees at the following location(s):
 - Restrooms and Restroom Building Chase
 - Employees are required to wear a face covering that covers the nose and mouth when interacting with others. District shall provide such face coverings to employees.
 - Boaters are recommended to wear face masks when interacting with staff.
 - Employees will limit the amount of contact with boats and the public during inspection and resealing process.
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B. Measures to Protect Boaters at Check-in, and during Boat Inspection

- Attendants shall wear face coverings.
 - Attendants shall sanitize their hands or change gloves frequently.
 - Boaters shall have their vessel ready to launch when entering the payment queue and remain within their vehicle during the inspection and payment process.
 - Payment processing by Credit Card transaction only. Boater shall remain in vehicle during processing. Credit Card will be sanitized before handing back to customer. Credit Card processing terminal will be sanitized after each transaction.
 - Once inspected and seal removed, boater shall proceed to the boat launch staging lane while maintaining physical distancing.
 - All employees have been instructed to maintain at least a six-foot distance from customers when possible.
 - All employees have been instructed to request customers prepare their boat for launch before entering the launch queue and to remain in their vehicles until ready to launch. If a customer does not comply with this or any other posted rule, an inspection shall be halted, and the customer may lose further launching privileges.
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C. Measures to Protect Boaters during Launch

- Due to COVID-19 CDC recommendations, the TVRA common gathering areas are being roped off to limit gatherings.
 - Once inspections and transactions have been completed, Boaters shall proceed to the boat launch while maintaining physical distancing.
 - Require boaters to prepare their vessel while waiting to launch and stay in their vehicle until it is their turn to launch.
 - Require boaters to maintain a minimum six-foot distance from anyone who is not a household member
 - Require boaters to leave the property immediately after exiting the water.
 - Trash cans should be touchless. Lids removed.
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D. Measures to Protect Boaters during Exiting Process

- Attendants shall wear face coverings.
 - Attendants shall sanitize their hands or change gloves frequently.
 - Require boaters to stay in their vehicle with their motor off during resealing, read posted signage and park vehicle and trailer within delineated areas for resealing.
 - Require boaters to leave the property immediately after resealing.
 - All employees have been instructed to maintain at least a six-foot distance from customers where possible.
 - All employees have been instructed to request customers remain in their vehicles during the sealing process. If a customer does not comply with this or any other posted rule, an inspection shall be halted, and the customer may lose further launching privileges.
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E. Measures to Increase Sanitization

- Disinfecting all high-contact surfaces frequently.
